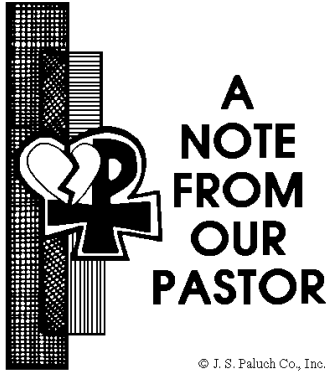

I wanted to share part of a Blog from Cardinal Dolan. I thought it was just too good to not share it with you. For the sake of space some of this has been edited.

All Are Welcome! The Church is *Catholic* . . . that means *all are welcome*; the Church is *one* . . . that means we have a Person — Jesus — and His moral teaching that unites us; the Church is *apostolic* . . . that means that His teaching was entrusted to His apostles, and carefully handed on by His Church. The sacred duty of the Church is to invite people, challenge people,

to live the message and teachings of Jesus.

Blessed John Paul II used to say that the best way to love someone was to tell them the truth: *To teach the truth with love*. Jesus did that — He was *love* and *truth* in His very person — and so does His Church. We love and respect everyone . . . but that doesn't necessarily mean we love and respect their *actions*. *Who* a person is? We love and respect him or her . . . *What* a person does? Truth may require that we tell the person we love that such actions are not consonant with what God has revealed.

We can never judge a person . . . but, we can judge a person's actions. Jesus did it best. Remember the woman caught in adultery? The elders were going to stone her. At the words of Jesus, they walked away. "Is there no one left to condemn you?" the Lord tenderly asked the accused woman. "No one, Sir," she whispered. "Neither do I condemn you," Jesus concluded. "Now go, but sin no more." Hate the sin; love the sinner . . .

So, for example, the Church loves, welcomes, and respects the alcoholic . . . but would not condone his binge; the Church loves, welcomes, and respects a prominent business leader . . . but would not condone his or her failure to pay a just wage to a migrant worker; the Church loves, welcomes, and respects a young couple in love . . . but would challenge their decision to "live together" before marriage; the Church loves, welcomes, and respects a woman who has had an abortion, and the man who fathered the child and encouraged the abortion. . . but would be united with them in mourning and regretting that deadly choice; the Church loves, welcomes, and respects a woman or man with a same-sex attraction . . . while reminding him or her of our clear teaching that, while the *condition* of homosexuality is no sin at all, still, God's teaching is clear that sexual *acts* are reserved for a man and woman united in the lifelong, life-giving, faithful, loving bond of marriage. The Church loves, welcomes, and respects wealthy people, while prophetically teaching the at-times-uncomfortable virtue of justice and charity towards the poor. We are part of a Church where, yes, *all are welcome*, but, no, not a Church of *anything goes*.

Remember last Sunday's moving gospel of Jesus, the Good Shepherd? An effective pastor cherishes, protects, feeds, and leads his flock, while welcoming his sheep into the fold. But . . . he will not let them wander off and do whatever or go wherever the sheep might want to go. His duty is to bring them back and rescue them from danger. This shepherd is still trying to learn how to be like that, to *love* all without ever compromising the *truth*.

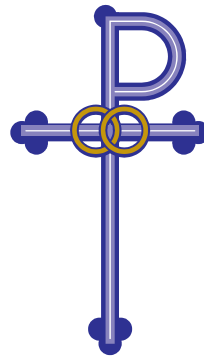

Respect for All Life

Struggling with Infertility

One in every six U.S. couples experiences infertility, but Catholic couples face additional confusion, worry, and frustration as they explore the medical options available to them. Filling a major void in Catholic resources, *The Infertility Companion for Catholics* is the first book to address not only the medical, emotional, and spiritual dimensions of infertility, but also the particular needs of Catholic couples who desire to understand and follow Church teaching on the use of assisted reproductive technology.

The authors, Angelique Ruhl-Lopez and Carmen Santamaria, offer support and wisdom from their own struggles with infertility. They describe the options that Catholic couples can pursue in seeking to conceive, many of which are not ordinarily presented by the medical community. In an encouraging and non-judgmental tone, they address both husbands and wives, helping them recognize the emotional impact of infertility on their relationship.

"The New Evangelization"

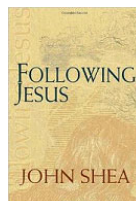
