

I would like to begin writing a series of articles concerning the most basic unit of the Catholic Church: the parish.

Part 1

One of the basic units of a church is a parish. It's where we pray, receive sacraments, and most of all it's the place where we experience our church. My favorite online resource is Wikipedia, so let's see what Wikipedia writes about parishes.

Most parishes are *territorial parishes*, which comprise all Catholics living within a defined geographic area. A parish may be joined with others in a deanery or *vicariate forane* and overseen by a *vicar forane*, also known as a *dean* or *archpriest*.

Per canon 518, a bishop may also erect non-territorial parishes, or *personal parishes*, within his see.

Personal parishes are created to better serve Catholics of a particular rite, language, nationality, or other commonality which make them a distinct community. Such parishes include the following:

- National parishes, established to serve the faithful of a certain ethnic group or national origin, offering services and activities in their native language.
- Parishes established to serve university students.
- Parishes established by the 7 July 2007 *motu proprio* Apostolic Letter *Summorum Pontificum* for those attached to the Extraordinary form of the Roman Rite (i.e. the traditional Latin Mass).
- Anglican Use parishes established by the Pastoral Provision or other dispensations for former members of the Episcopal Church in the United States. By nature, communities belonging to the personal ordinariates for Anglicans as established by *Anglicanorum Coetibus* of 4 November 2009 are also personal parishes.

All Catholics who reside in a territorial parish are considered members of that territorial parish, and all members of a community for which a personal parish has been erected are similarly members of that personal parish. Membership should not be confused with registration or worship, however. Catholics are not obliged to worship only in the parish church to which they belong, but may for convenience or taste attend services in any Catholic church.

We do not have any parishes that are formed around a university nor do we have an Anglican Use Parish yet, however St. Joseph's Parish in Rockdale has become a parish where the traditional Latin mass is celebrated. The only National Parish is Divine Mercy Polish Church in Lombard.

The Diocese of Joliet is comprised of 7 counties. They are DuPage, Will, Kendall, Grundy, Kankakee, Ford, and Iroquois counties. It's an interesting bit of trivia that Kankakee, IL is the geographical center of our diocese.

The Diocese of Joliet is beginning a process of realigning church organizations and structures so it can better serve the needs of the parishioners. In the last issue of Christ Is Our Hope Magazine, it gives us a view on how the Deaneries have been realigned. Our Diocese has established a new deanery in DuPage County; before there were just two deaneries and now there are three. In the past, Christ the Servant Parish and St. Scholastica Parish were in different deaneries, with Rt. 355 being the dividing line. Now things are readjusted so we are together again.



Maybe it's you.


Requirements are: A willingness to share your faith and a commitment of an hour and 15 minutes a week with the students.
