Dear Parishioners,

The Finance Committee met recently to discuss our current financial situation and to plan for the budget for next year. As you all know, this past winter was very difficult. We budgeted \$6000 for snow removal and we spent \$16,099. I think we were over our snow removal budget in the early part of December. As you probably noticed at home, charges for natural gas were very high this winter, as well.

Also we did not have a major fundraiser this fiscal year, and in combination with the snow and cold, that brought our financial situation into the red columns for this year. Because of the \$18,400 shortage, we are asking you to help us by donating to a "13th month" envelope, enclosed with this bulletin. (Extras are available in the narthex.) We used a "13th month" envelope in 2012 to some success and we find we really need it to be successful again this year.

It's hard for me to come to you hat in hand and ask for financial help. I know what people say, "He is always asking for money." In reality, I try to do it two times a year, for our annual stewardship and for the diocesan Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal, but there is a time when there just isn't enough money to pay our bills.

What we are asking is for you to consider making a contribution equal to what you normally give in one month to help us make up our shortfall. Or, you could use this as an opportunity to catch up on the commitment you made last fall, and maybe haven't been keeping up on. Please try to be as generous as you can, and please try to have your contribution in the parish office by June 29.

Fortnight for Freedom

The third annual Fortnight for Freedom will be held this year from June 21 to July 4, Independence Day. The U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) asks the nation's Catholics, and even non-Catholics, to participate in this period of prayer, fasting and advocacy to respond to the many threats to religious liberty our country now faces. For example, sometime during this year's Fortnight for Freedom, the U.S. Supreme Court is expected to announce its decisions in two cases in which for-profit businesses, Hobby Lobby and Conestoga Wood Specialties Corporation, are challenging the new federal health insurance law's requirement that, in spite of their religious objections, they must provide coverage for certain abortion-inducing drugs.

A Fortnight for Freedom opening Mass, celebrated by Knights of Columbus Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori, will be held at 5:30 pm on June 21 at the Basilica of the Assumption in Baltimore, MD. Cardinal Donald Wuerl will celebrate the closing Mass on July 4 at noon at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. Both Masses will be televised live on EWTN.

ATTENTION: ALL VOLUNTEERS AND PARENTS



The Gift of Fatherhood

Father's Day is a time for taking stock of one's fatherhood. What is it that fathers give to their families?

1) Fathers should share with their wives a keen sense of responsibility to ensure that their family has the basic necessities of life. A husband shares with his wife the responsibility of providing a secure, loving home for their children. It is important for children to know that they are loved. When a father and mother love and respect each other, children tend to feel more secure, and are more likely to believe that mom and dad love them.

2) Fathers need to develop a strengthened resolve to show a deeper interest in what is important to their wives and children. So put down the paper, turn off the smart phone, the TV, and the computer, and show a personal interest in the ups and downs of family life.


3) Fathers should be involved in all the activities of their families to bear witness to what is truly good in God's eyes—helping them grow in virtue amid the practicalities and stresses of daily life.

4) Fathers play a crucial role in helping their children become men and women of faith by providing good example, e.g. bringing the family to Mass every Sunday. The prayer of St. Francis tells us that "it is in giving that we receive." In giving of themselves in love, husbands and fathers discover what gifts really matter.

RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.
