

Catholic Charities' DuPage County Back to School Fair Needs Your Help!

The Back to School Fair will be held on Wednesday, August 6th at the Odeum Expo Center in Villa Park, IL from 11:00 am – 6:00 pm. This totally free event is open to any DuPage family who lives near or below the poverty level. Over five thousand children and their families will receive a wide variety of health and human services. Some of the medical services offered include dental and vision screenings. Catholic Charities, in collaboration with the Regional Office of Education, will also give all of the school-age children school supplies and/or a \$10 certificate for the exclusive purchase of school supplies.

The fair is a successful collaboration of over 100 public and private agencies dedicated to improving the needs of low-income families. **It costs over \$30,000 to operate the fair and we need your help to make sure every child is prepared for school this fall.**

DuPage County is the third most affluent county in Illinois which contributes to a widespread misperception that there are no poor people in the county. In reality, although a significant number of households in DuPage are affluent, over 60,000 persons live on an income below the federal poverty level. Over half of these individuals are school children!

**Change Our Lives-
Change Our Culture**

Last year, on Independence Day, I attended a Chicago-area Freedom Mass at St.

Lambert's Parish in Skokie. The celebrant and homilist was Fr. Rocky, from Relevant Radio. The following were some of his statements. "We have come here today to thank God for the many freedoms we enjoy in our country, and to pray—as our Bishops have requested—for the protection of life, marriage, and religious liberty. We cannot take our freedoms for granted, but neither should we exaggerate our present afflictions. However, we would be foolish to underestimate the danger of the present moment. For the past 40 years, the right to life of an entire class of humans has been systematically denied (Roe v. Wade). And now, our Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Conscience have been threatened and in some cases compromised through legislation. But we Catholics—at ALL levels—have NOT been faithful to God. And as the Church goes, so goes society. We have to change ourselves if we are going to change the culture. And we either change the culture, or the culture will change us. What the Church needs, and our country yearns for, is an authentic blossoming of personal holiness. We need to pray—a lot. Go to Mass—frequently. Go to Confession—regularly. Fill your soul with grace, and then you will grow in courage and find the power to be a witness. Sacrifice yourself—for Christ, for Catholic media and education, and for your family and neighborhood."

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), at parish reconciliation services during Advent and Lent, or by appointment with Fr. Frank.

To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, help driving to appointments, emergency meals, or anyone needing 2 hour respite care for a homebound family member call Deacon Tom F.
