




As many of you have figured out, I like history, especially local history. Bishop Siegel, who shares a similar interest, approached me when he was here celebrating the sacrament of confirmation. We have a book in the sacristy called the ordo which gives directions on what prayers to say at mass and readings, feast days, etc. As a part of that ordo there is a necrology. The Necrology is a list of our deceased priests. Bishop Siegel thought it may be a good thing to include the obituary, or stories or memories of the deceased priests from our diocese. The first one I shared was our founding pastor, Fr. Jim Ratigan. Today I would like to share information about someone many of the old timers may know. It's Fr. Ed Gregory. Fr. Gregory was the founder of St. Dominic's Parish in Bolingbrook.

**Rev. Edmund Gregory
Oct. 30, 1922 - June 13, 1980**

Fr. Edmund Gregory, 58, a native of Joliet and founding pastor of St. Dominic's Parish in Bolingbrook was found dead on Saturday at St. Ambrose rectory in Crest Hill. He had been in residence there in recent months. Fr. Gregory developed a heart condition in 1977 while serving as pastor at St. Joseph Parish in Manteno. As a result he resigned his pastorate the following June.

Subsequently he was in residency in St. Patrick Church in Joliet, and later in Crest Hill. Known through the diocese as a kind hearted, considerate individual, he over extended himself to be of help to other priests. He visited many parishes in recent months offering Masses to lighten the schedule of other priests. He was a regular celebrant of Mass at the Guardian Angel Home in Joliet. As recently as last Sunday he was at the Maternity BVM parish picnic in Bourbonnais.



Fr. Gregory was ordained a priest in May 1949, in the first ordination class in the new Diocese of Joliet. His first assignment took him to St. Mary Nativity Parish in Joliet where he spent three years. He also served at St. Petronille in Glen Ellyn. His first pastorate came when he was placed in charge of St. Mary Parish in Reddick in October of 1957. He remained for three years also serving at St. Lawrence O'Toole parish in Essex. At one time he was pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish in Braidwood. In 1960 he was assigned to be the founding pastor at St. Dominic Parish in Bolingbrook. Nine years later he was sent to St. Joseph Parish in Manteno.

Father was educated in the Joliet schools system. He studied for the priesthood at St. Procopius in Lisle and Kenrick Seminary in St. Louis, MO. At one time he was president of the Manteno Rotary club. He served as dean of Kankakee-Grundy deanery and was a member of the Priests Senate, the Diocesan Consultant. He was also a fourth degree Knights of Columbus and chaplain of the Joliet KSKJ, a Slovenian organization. He was buried at St. Joseph Parish in Joliet.


LITURGICAL DANCE

Protecting God's Children


ATTENTION: ALL VOLUNTEERS AND PARENTS

Holiness is simply the application of the values, principles, and spirit of the Gospel to the circumstances of everyday life. Holiness is the goal of the Christian life. It's a dynamic collaboration between God and man that brings delight to God. It is surrendering to the will of God. Holiness is for everyone; NOT just a select few. It is the delight and the desire of God, and the source of your happiness.

RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), at parish reconciliation services during Advent and Lent, or by appointment with Fr. Frank.
