
Our Mission

Jesus came to save us; let us not reject this marvelous gift.

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ Feb. 8, 2015

Dear Friends,

Jesus proclaims the gospel of God to people, which literally means the "good news" of God. Jesus speaks to our need and enters into the drudgery and pain of our lives which Job expresses in the first reading, and the suffering we see in the lives of the people Jesus heals.

That is what he came for, he tells his disciples as they come looking for him while he is in prayer. Jesus recharges his battery through prayer in order to serve. That is exactly what we need to do, to be centered, rooted, and grounded in God, the author and source of all life. Then we will have the energy to live and serve as Jesus did. Relying on just our own energy, we burn out.

We see a very clear example of that in the healing of Peter's mother in law. She is sick with a fever, Jesus takes her hand and raises her up, restoring her to health and happiness. She immediately begins to serve and wait on them!


That is the ideal outcome of Jesus' work, healing that creates servant-minded disciples. The gospel of God really is good news for us. It effectively, and affectively, transforms our lives into lives of selfless love and service. It transforms the drudgery and pain of our lives into something glorious!

Cold and Snow! So, what did you expect in the winter in northern Illinois?



Human/Sex Trafficking

Several statements from *January 31st Speak Out, Illinois 2015 conference* breakout workshop: "Sex Trafficking—Recognizing It and Doing Something About It."

- "There can be no keener revelation of a society's soul than the way it treats its children." - Nelson Mandela
- The grim reality of human trafficking: 800,000 persons trafficked in international borders each year; 1 million are exploited through global sex trade; 50% are children; 80% are girls/women.
- Who could have imagined a modern civilization permitting coerced contraception, compulsory abortion, sterilization, and widespread infanticide?
- More children have been killed in the last 100 years than in the entire history of humanity.
- Chicago ranks 10th in the world for human.sex trafficking.
- Yet, Chicago has only one victims' safe house—with 8 beds!
- "We are born into this world with sealed orders from God. I suggest yours—like mine—read: Save Children."



Sacramental Information

RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or at parish reconciliation services during Advent and Lent, or by appointment with Fr. Joel.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, help driving to appointments, emergency meals, or anyone needing 2 hour respite care for a homebound family member call Deacon Tom F.
