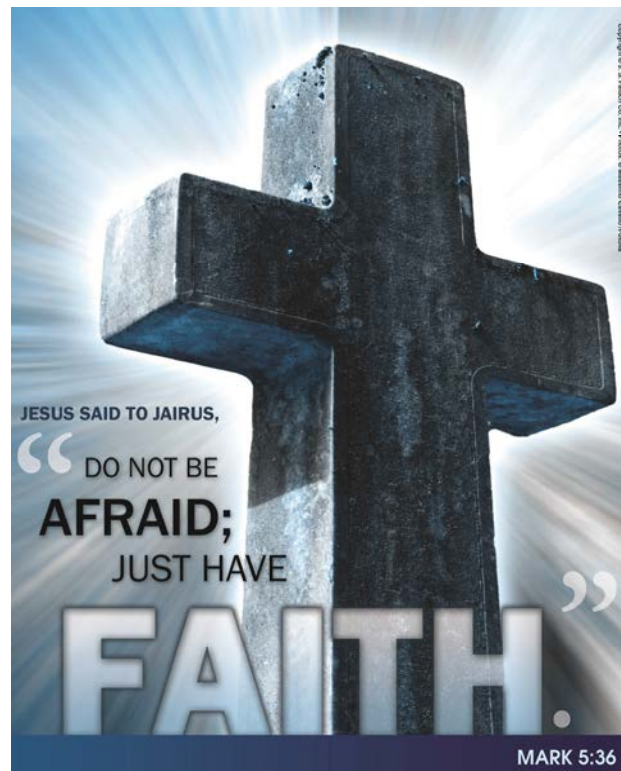
Our Mission

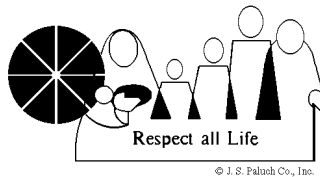

Strengthening a Struggling Marriage

Most problems that develop in a marriage can be overcome. Even one spouse can begin to effect change. When you're unhappy with your spouse, two basic approaches can be taken to resolve the problem, and both are important.



#1 Take Action. Some actions to try on your own:

Experiment and test the results. Try shaking up some of your habitual reactions. Stop criticizing. Break the pattern by complimenting, even for a routine task. Take a break from problem-solving, which can be demoralizing and exhausting. Reflect on whatever works. When something goes right, don't downplay it.

#2 Find New Ways to Communicate. The important factor is not what we say, but how we say it. Instead of criticizing, talk about feelings using "I" statements, expressing personal needs. Becoming defensive doesn't help to reduce conflicts. Stay away from the word "Why." Avoid stonewalling and forms of contempt. All couples fight, criticize each other, and become defensive occasionally, but it's healthier to take steps to de-escalate tensions by asking an honest question, making a suggestion, an offer, or an apology.

rites of Christian Initiation Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

Baptism of Infants Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or at parish reconciliation services during Advent and Lent, or by appointment with Fr. Joel.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, help driving to appointments, emergency meals, or anyone needing 2 hour respite care for a homebound family member call Deacon Tom F.
