- Human trafficking is the largest criminal enterprise in the world?
- The United States is one of the top three destination points for trafficked victims?
- An estimated 13 million children are enslaved around the world today, accounting for nearly half of trafficking victims in the world?
- According to estimates, approximately 80% of trafficking involves sexual exploitation and 19% involves labor exploitation?
- National sporting events, such as the Super Bowl and the World Series generate billions of dollars for the sex trafficking trade?

What can you do about it?





A Disappointing Law

California's bishops have expressed disappointment with Governor Brown's signing of a measure legalizing physician-assisted suicide in the state, saying the law stands in direct contradiction to providing compassionate, quality care for those facing a terminal illness. The bishops pointed out that the 48 Catholic hospitals in California provide excellent palliative care services as all medical facilities for terminally ill patients should but often do not. The California Catholic Conference said it was proud to work with Californians Against Assisted Suicide and its partners, and they would continue to stand with them in efforts to protect the most vulnerable Californians.

RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or at parish reconciliation services during Advent and Lent, or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, help driving to appointments, emergency meals, or anyone needing 2 hour respite care for a homebound family member call Deacon Tom F.

FUNERALS Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.
