



Fourth Sunday of Lent

Names do define us.

There is a lot of name calling in the Bible readings proclaimed today. “Brothers and sisters”—those bound together in Christ. “New creation”—those drowned in baptismal waters washing away original sin. “Ambassadors for Christ”—those who proclaim the Savior’s presence among us by behaviors and actions and, perhaps, even words. “Tax collectors and sinners”—harsh names, but names of those with whom Jesus eats. “Children”—at first, selfish and misbehaving, but then full of sense and repentant because the parent is full of love and forgiveness.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one’s needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

Water for Flint, Michigan

Hope’s on the Way, a committee of Deacons of the Archdiocese of Chicago, is heading a drive to get bottles of water to Catholic Charities of Flint, MI. Catholic Charities in Flint is distributing 3000 bottles of water per day.

A retailer in Hammond, IN, *Stack & Van Til*, has agreed to sell the water at cost to fill a truck. Furniture chain *Art Van Furniture* is donating a driver to drive the truck from Hammond to Flint, Michigan.

Parishioner Dan Troy is a retired deacon from the Archdiocese of Chicago, and is on the *Hope’s on the Way* Committee. The committee is raising the money to purchase the water to fill the truck. We will be accepting donations to help offset the cost of the water through March 20.





Help Needed

Holy Week is the busiest week of the year for the Art & Environment Team. It starts with removing Lenten décor and putting up red décor for **Palm Sunday**. This can be done late in the week through Saturday morning in order to be ready for the Palm Sunday masses.

Holy Thursday décor comes next. This can be done either Wednesday afternoon or Thursday morning. The biggest thing that needs doing is preparing the tabernacle for the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament following the Mass of the Lord's Supper.

Good Friday décor is simple. Remove all signs of Holy Thursday décor, and place the large cross for veneration at the front of the church.

Easter is the most important day of the year, and deservedly is one of the two most elaborate days of the year. Décor for Easter takes place Saturday morning right after the Blessing of Baskets and Foods. Hanging of banners, placing of flowers, refill the font, and so on.

Can you help? Now is a good time! Which of the above stated times works best for you? Offering to help for one does not commit you to all of them.



Inspiring Vocations in our Parishes

Have you ever wondered how you can help with the number of priests and religious in our diocese? One of my goals is to have a Vocation Committee in every parish. On Saturday, Feb. 28, the Joliet Diocese



Vocation Office invited Rhonda Gruenewald, national author and speaker, to lead a conference based upon her recently published book "Hundredfold—A Guide to Parish Vocation Ministry." For this meeting, Bishop Conlon commissioned parish representatives to suggest practical plans for promoting vocations, and to present the plan to their pastors for approval to implement. We all know that there has been a decline in men and women vocations since the 1960s. Currently, in this diocese there are 42 seminarians studying for the priesthood, the largest group since 1983. God continues to call men and women to follow Him as priests, brothers, and sisters. We need more people to pray for vocations daily. And we can learn new ways to invite young people to consider this life of service and joy.

A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.
