

PGC is an awareness and safe environment program. The target audience is adults that volunteer with children. Many past participants have shared that they believe **all parents**

would benefit by attending. This program is a proactive response to dealing with some of the situations of the world in which we live today. It has been designed to raise our awareness of the issues and provide ways to respond by creating a safe environment for our children.

Out of concern for the safety and well-being of children, **all adults**, who have significant contact with children at our parish **must** participate in the Protecting God's Children Program. This program is mandated by the Diocese of Joliet in accordance with the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*.

Reflecting on God's Word

The story is told of a priest who was a brilliant scholar and an extraordinary lecturer. His one concern in life was the position he would hold at God's eternal banquet. One night, in a dream, an angel revealed that he should expect to be seated next to the butcher from Regenberg. The priest was aghast. Surely a mistake, he thought. He decided to set out for Regenberg to see the man who would be his companion for eternity. As he traveled, he thought to himself that perhaps this butcher was really a man of great distinction who had fallen on hard times and was temporarily forced to cut meat for a living. With that thought, he tried to console himself.

In Regenberg, the priest found the butcher working quietly at his trade. He asked him if he had been a butcher all his life. The butcher replied, "Yes, I have, my good man, but I'm a second-rate butcher. You see, I have not had much time to devote to my trade. I have two elderly parents and they are very helpless in the daily tasks of life. As a result, much of my time is consumed in their care. Every day I must bathe them, clothe them, and feed them. And there's the cleaning and washing of clothes."

The priest, with tears in his eyes, knelt down, kissed the rough hands of the butcher, and thanked God for giving him a place in heaven next to a man of such great distinction.

Nobel Peace Prize for her humanitarian efforts. At the time of her death in 1977, The Missionaries of Charity numbered more than 4,000—in addition to thousands more lay volunteers—with 610 foundations in 123 countries around the world.

On Sunday, September 4th, at 5.30 pm there will be a special Mass in celebration of Blessed Mother Teresa's canonization. A light reception will follow which will include Indian food, music, and opportunities to learn more about Blessed Mother Teresa and her religious order, the Missionaries of Charity.

Respect for All Life

Do You Need an Advance Directive?

Do you need an advance directive if: 1) you are young and healthy, 2) you are in poor health, 3) you have discussed your wishes about health care decisions with your family. For all these, the answer is YES. You are at risk unless you have taken the simple but necessary step of signing an advance directive that will protect you if you ever are unable to make your own health care decisions. This is known as a Durable Power of Attorney (DPA) for health care. It's **NOT** the same as another type of advance directive known as a "living will," which can be dangerous because it actually gives power over your life and death to an unknown physician. With a DPA for health care, you designate a trusted family member or friend to make health care decisions for you if you are unable—either temporarily or permanently—to do so yourself. DPA is essential for anyone who is 18 years old or older, not just for the very sick or very old. It is critically important that the wording of the DPA complies with the laws of your state. The Patient Rights Council has formulated the Protective Medical Decisions Document (PMDD) that will be specifically drafted for each individual. The PMDD gives the person you name to make your health care decisions the authority to act on your behalf.

Sacramental Information

rites of Christian Initiation Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

HOLY ORDERS: Are you thinking of becoming a priest or religious? Talk with Fr. Bob or email Fr. Burke Masters at frburke23@aol.com.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, help driving to appointments, or emergency meals, call Deacon Tom F.

FUNERALS Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.


