

A Documentary on "Mercy"

Pope Francis has inspired millions by urging to embrace Mercy, ultimately revealed in the face of Christ. The Knights of

Columbus' new documentary film, "The Face of Mercy," is a powerful message that brings hope, healing and forgiveness to a broken world. The story unfolds, from an unpretentious Polish nun who experienced powerful visions of a merciful God, to her countryman Pope John Paul II who propelled the message of Divine Mercy on to the world stage, and now the "Year of Mercy" bestowed upon the Church by Pope Francis. The film seamlessly weaves together theology and history with modern testimonials and visual effects, creating a remarkable tapestry of what mercy looks like in our modern world. Meet the woman who found freedom in forgiveness after seeing her family wiped out by genocide; the former-NFL linebacker who quit football to share Christ's mercy with the homeless; the baseball player who traded MLB ambition for the monastery; the priest with a drug-dealing past; and the young woman who chose mercy towards her husband's killer. These testimonies remind us that Divine Mercy is alive, present, and will transform the world. The Face of Mercy will air in Chicago on ABC Channel 7 on November 27th at 2:30 AM. RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

HOLY ORDERS: Are you thinking of becoming a priest or religious? Talk with Fr. Bob or email Fr. Burke Masters at frburke23@aol.com.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, help driving to appointments, or emergency meals, call Deacon Tom F.

What can you do with your old computer, printer, fax machine or television? Where can you bring coats and jackets that are in good condition?

The easy answer is to take your old electronic equipment and coats to the **Electronic Recycling Event and Coat Collection** in the parking lot of Christ the Servant (8700 Havens Drive, Woodridge) on Saturday, November 5, 2016 from 8:30 to 11:30. The **Green Team** at Christ the Servant is hosting this event.

What will be collected?

Almost anything with a cord attached to it! This includes computer equipment, cell phones, extension cords, copy machines, hard drives, etc. Rechargeable batteries, CD's, cassette tapes and VHS tapes are also collected. **All electronics are costly to recycle. Donation fees may be requested for all electronics. There is a \$25 charge for TV's less than 21" (corner to corner) and a \$35 charge for TV's 21" and over. Cash or credit cards will be accepted (no checks). All items should be unboxed and free of excess packaging materials.**

What is unacceptable for this collection?

White Goods, air conditioners, hazardous waste, radioactive waste, bio-hazardous waste or mercury containing devices like light bulbs or thermostats.
