Serving God from your Heart



The **CHRISTIAN SERVICE COMMISSION**, an umbrella group for separate service ministries led and staffed by parishioner/volunteers, invites all to our quarterly meetings held to discuss past actions, current plans and general commission matters. Each ministry plans and coordinates its own activities. There are currently 12 Christian Service Commission Ministries. This week's focus is on the following:

Cash For Food drives are held 4 weekends each year. Bulletin articles and narthex displays begin two weeks before the collection date. Donated goods are received in the parking lot before each Mass. Cash/check donations to the West Suburban Community Food Pantry are encouraged and are converted into food very effectively by the pantry. Christ the Servant has a long-standing relationship with WSCFP.

Diaper Days - Twice each year and on-call as needed, Baby Diapers and associated hygiene

products are collected via parishioner drop-off donations for clients of West Suburban Community Food Pantry and Women's Choice Services. Volunteers prep bulletin and after-Mass announcements, set collection pick-up dates, and respond to emergency requests. Usually a playpen is set-up in the narthex to receive donated diapers. Those items are then delivered to the distributing agencies.

Undy Sunday - This Weekend in conjunction with Catholic Charities Undy Sunday, an appeal for and collection of new underclothing for low income children, families & seniors is made parish-wide. Bulletin notices, decorations and signage are created. A pack-n-play crib is set up at the designated weekend Masses. Donations are taken to the designated drop off location.

Respect for All Life

For Our Teens: "Surprising Tips for Love that our Culture Won't Tell You"



Guys and girls reflect God in different ways—not just in physical differences, but because we're both body and soul, in other ways too. We're called to discover how to love all people and develop healthy relationships—not just romantic ones—in the unique way God created us, as male and female. Chastity as a virtue—a habit of doing good—affects not only what we do or don't do, but also what we say, think, watch, listen to, read, and much more. How should we deal with this?

- 1) **Commit**—make the decision to do your best; choose to strive to live chastely—that the best way to attain virtue.
- 2) **Pray**—talk to God about your desires and struggles; pray for help in understanding this virtue.
- 3) **Talk**—have people in your life who will hold you accountable to support your resolve.
- 4) **Learn**—search Catholic websites for more information; pay attention to what your struggles and temptations are—knowledge is power—the better our understanding of ourselves and of chastity, the easier it will be to love more truly.
- 5) **Dress modestly**—we have immeasurable, God-given dignity. Dressing modestly means dressing purposefully.

rites of Christian Initiation Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

Baptism of Infants Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

Marriage Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.
