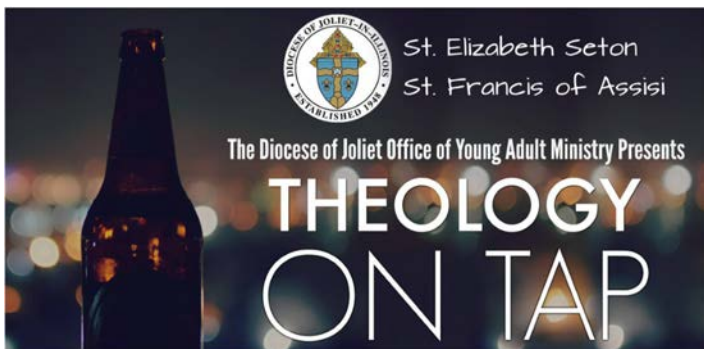

"In the past year, Peace and Social Justice has contributed events to promote the meaning of the peace pole and peace cranes along with their significance in the world. We held events where people could understand that origami cranes were not only beautiful but promoted equality, freedom, and harmony within the world. . . .

"Additionally, once a year we hold an Ethical Trade market fair in our church to support equality in the workplace and work against child exploitation. . . . [D]uring these events we provide background on the benefits of buying Ethical Trade products because they guarantee that the producers of the products are treated and paid fairly around the globe. The Ethical Trades mission is to create a world where all workers are free from exploitation and discrimination and enjoy conditions of freedom, security, and equality. . . .

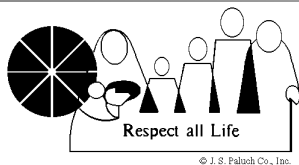

## Respect for All Life

### If I Can't Forgive, Can I receive Communion?

During the sign of peace, we shake hands with or embrace our family and neighbors around us. We do this because Jesus instructed us to be reconciled with our brothers and sisters before approaching the altar. But what if you can't forgive someone? Are you still able to receive Communion? Jesus tells us that if we are at odds with our brother—meaning we haven't forgiven from the heart—before we make an offering at the altar, we should be reconciled to our brother. Forgive him from the heart, and then you can receive fruitfully. To refuse to forgive is to cut yourself off from God's forgiveness and it cuts you off from that person or person you refuse to forgive. So, you really shouldn't receive Communion until you forgive. To forgive someone means you want what's truly good for the other. Often, what's truly good for the other who has done harmful things is that he/she changes, is reconciled, and stops doing things that hurt people. We don't want others to suffer eternal loss—we want them to become the saints they are called to be. So, because God loves all of us, we have to love even our enemies.

## Sacramental Information

**rites of Christian Initiation** Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

**BAPTISM OF INFANTS** Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

**MARRIAGE** Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

**HOLY ORDERS:** Are you thinking of becoming a priest or religious? Talk with Fr. Bob or email Fr. Burke Masters at frburke23@aol.com.

**RECONCILIATION** Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK** Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, call Deacon Tom F.

**FUNERALS** Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.
