# Religious Formation

*There are a lot of things going on at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. To help our RF kids get more out of the Mass some of the students have been learning about the sacred items used, the reasons behind the rituals and the meaning of the words you will find at Church. This is one of the things that they have learned:*

**Tabernacle** comes from a lengthy Latin word, *tabernaculum* which means “hut” or “tent” and is the fixed, locked box, usually behind the altar or in a side chapel. The tabernacle can be thought of as the little house or “tent” where Jesus resides sacramentally—

Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—in each consecrated Host. Hosts that remain after Holy Communion are then stored in the tabernacle



and locked to protect the precious gift of Jesus inside. Tabernacles, after Christianity became legal in the fourth century, began to be the storage places for Jesus present in the Eucharist. But tabernacle has roots in the Old Testament when Moses commissioned a tabernacle to be built to hold the Ark of the Covenant, the dwelling place of God among the Israelites. Today we also honor Mary as the first tabernacle that held the presence of Jesus, so we call Mary the Ark of the New Covenant. → next column

Since we are created for relationships with each other and with God, Jesus remains present to strength our relationship with Him by dwelling in his little “tent” waiting for us. St. Therese once wrote, “do you realize that Jesus is there in the tabernacle expressly for you—for you alone? He burns with the desire to come into your heart... don’t listen to the demon, laugh at him, and go without fear to receive the Jesus of peace and love.”

## Respect for All Life

### Anti Human Trafficking Law is One Year Old

Last January, the U.S. Congress passed the Frederick Douglass Trafficking Victims Prevention and Protection Act. Led by Rep, Chris Smith, the law authorized \$430 million for 4 years to help combat sex and labor trafficking both in the U.S. and abroad. In the fight to end modern day slavery, the law honors the legacy of Frederick Douglass, a former slave who became a prominent abolitionist. The law provides resources for trafficking prevention education for children; shelter, therapies, and reintegration assistance for trafficking survivors; the facilitation of trafficking-free supply chains in the U.S.; training of government and airline industry employees to identify trafficking cases; and oversight to ensure that government purchases are not employing traffickers. The bulk of allocations will go to the State Department to fund their educational and diplomatic efforts. The legislation also provides funding to the International Megan's Law, establishing country-to-country notification about convicted pedophiles.

**rites of Christian Initiation** Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

**BAPTISM OF INFANTS** Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

**MARRIAGE** Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.
