Most needed are people to assist with what we call "Host Team", greeting people as they arrive, handing out the music booklets, recruiting someone to present the gifts, passing the baskets for the collection, directing the flow of communicants, and distributing bulletins at the end of mass. rites of Christian Initiation Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

HOLY ORDERS: Are you thinking of becoming a priest or religious? Talk with Fr. Bob or email Fr. Steven Borello vocations@dioceseofjoliet.org.

RECONCILIATION Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK Please contact the parish office for a visit from a priest when sickness occurs or death is imminent for the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. To arrange for Communion to be brought to the sick/homebound members of the parish community, call Deacon Tom F.

FUNERALS Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.

Mary: I had the opportunity to set up the bathroom. When I was done, I stepped back and marveled at the color coordination our donors had managed. The bathroom, while still with the original fixtures and tile, had the color scheme of pink and gray. The bright floral shower curtain with a white background was so pretty and cheerful, while the bath towels, which I placed on a towel rack, were gray with a pretty border. It was as if the Holy Spirit knew where these were going and guided each donor to pick out the perfect items. I hung the hangars in the closet and imagined how nice it would be for this family to have someplace to hang their own clothes. The family was scheduled to arrive shortly after we finished. I really felt privileged to be able to help set up the apartment. The quality of the donations reflected that our CTS family chose these items as if they were choosing for their own families.

Lorena: (on setting up the kitchen with Bonnie) As I was helping unpack all of the generous donations, I felt such gratitude for having been a part of this experience. I was helping a family feel welcomed to the United States by doing such a small act of kindness. It overall made me realize how small acts of kindness by different individuals can be combined to create a much bigger impact, which I got to experience in person myself. I will cherish this amazing opportunity and look forward to continuing to help with other projects in the near future.

In conclusion, your generosity made a great impact on the people from the Exodus organization. Bonnie wanted us to share that we (CTS) sound like an incredible church body and that they (Exodus) really appreciate the way we all came together alongside of God in welcoming this refugee family to America. (Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ)

What is a Eucharistic procession?

It is a “public witness of faith and worship of the Most Blessed Sacrament” (Holy

Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass. Founded upon the Church’s belief that Jesus becomes substantially present to us in the Eucharist at Mass, the Corpus Christi procession is one of the ways that we express our devotion to Christ.

A Corpus Christi procession usually begins after the celebration of Mass, at which the host for the procession is consecrated. Placed in a monstrance



(a sacred vessel that displays the sacred host to the faithful), the Blessed Sacrament is then carried out of the church and through the streets or neighborhood accompanied by the songs and prayers of the people. **(CTS’ procession will be around the circle in the parking lot)** Often along the route the procession will stop, and the people are blessed. In this way the Church shows that Christ, here among us, walks with us on our pilgrimage to heaven.




