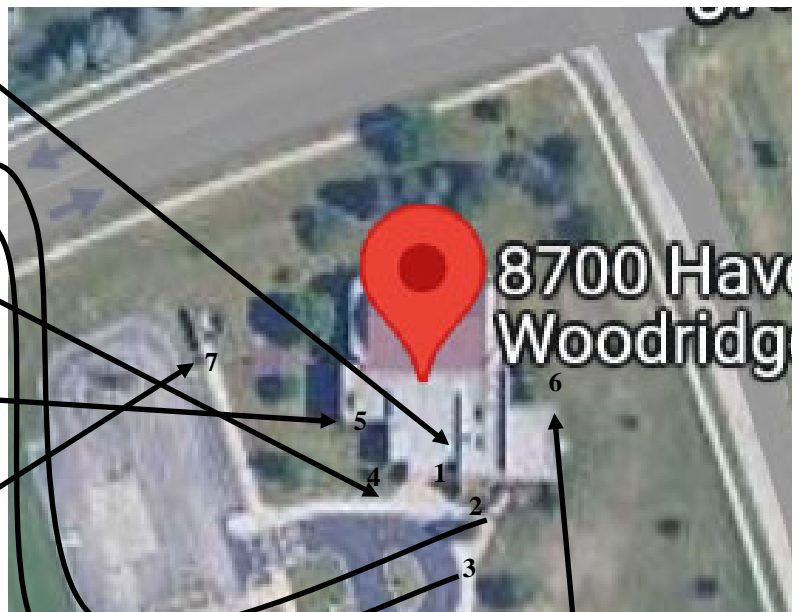

Choose a section you would like to Adopt.

1. Area to the right of the entrance door, or
2. Area to the right in front of the kitchen, or
3. Tree area to the right as you enter the front door, or
4. Area to the left of the front door, or
5. Area around the Sacristy to the corner of building, or
6. Corner area on the east side of building.
7. Around the garbage corral. (Berm area under a professional paid project.)

LEONARD M. JARKA SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Winners of the Leonard M. Jarka Memorial Scholarships for 2022 were announced by Knights of Columbus Council 5918 at its Annual Officer Installation Ceremony on June 12th.

Scholarship applicants must demonstrate high levels of performance in the classroom and in activities outside the classroom. They must also show a commitment to and experience with volunteerism. This quality must be supported by the candidates' own essays on the meaning of volunteerism, as well as through letters submitted by a sponsor, a school counselor, and from the candidates themselves as to their fitness to receive the award.

For 2022, a \$500.00 High School Scholarship was awarded to Andrew S from St. Scholastica Parish. Andrew will use his award to study at Montini Catholic High School.

At the college level, a \$1500.00 Scholarship was awarded to Annabella C from Christ the Servant Parish. Annabella will attend Illinois State University in the fall.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:30 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.
