

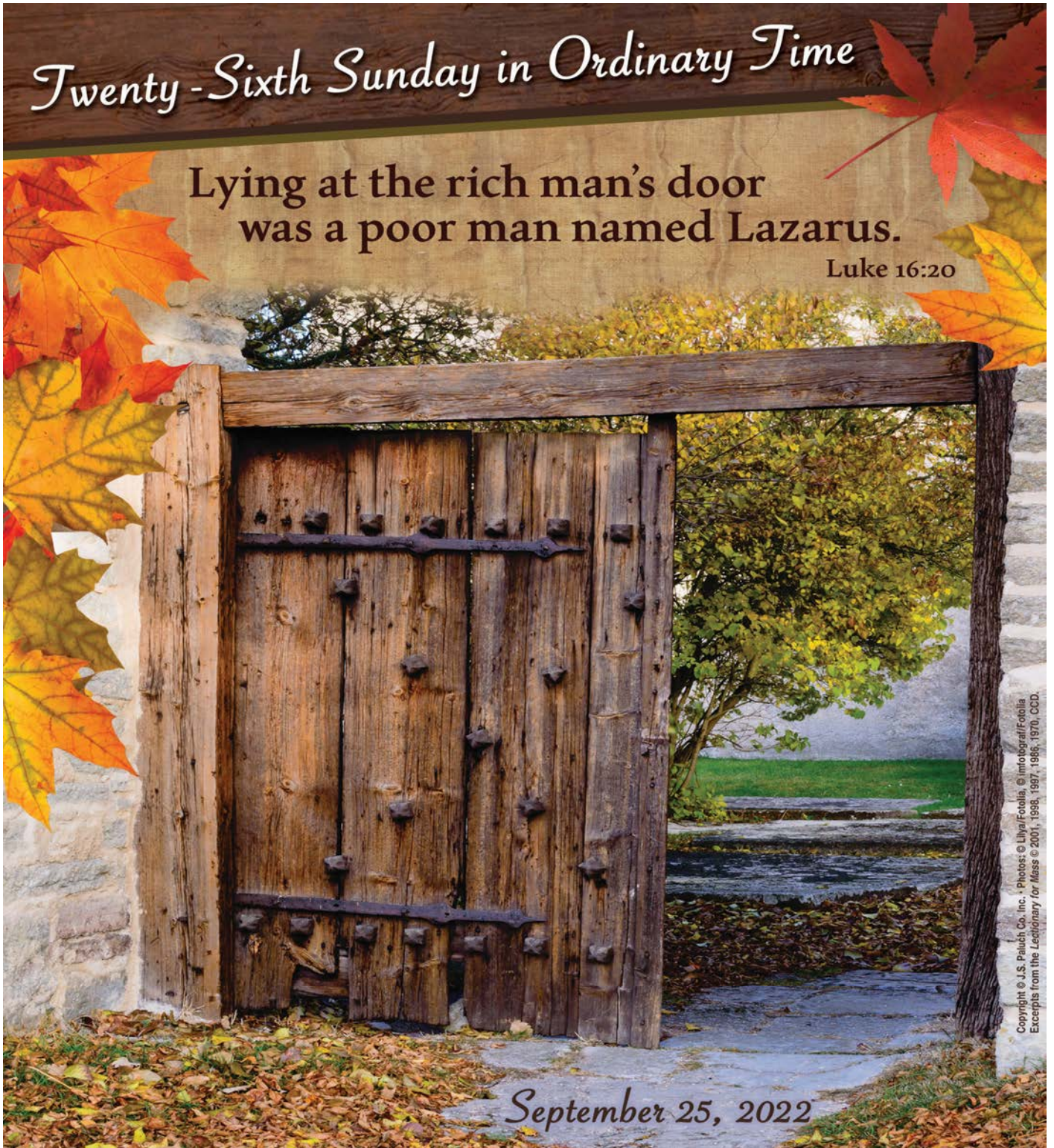

ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT
Fiscal Year July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022**

The enclosed page is our parish annual financial statement for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022; along with a comparison to the prior fiscal year.

As we continue to emerge from the stresses of the COVID-19 pandemic, I thank you for your continued strong support of Christ the Servant Parish. It is wonderful to be able to have the pandemic restrictions lessened so that we may worship together in safety and fellowship. Not everyone feels comfortable attending mass in person yet (though we do continue to offer socially distanced seating along the perimeter of the sanctuary), so we do continue with the recorded Sunday masses on Facebook and YouTube. Including a small chat with our special canine guests at the end!

Because of the economic uncertainty surrounding COVID-19, the parish did apply and received a loan under the second round of the government's Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). This action occurred with the approval of the diocese and was very helpful in covering payroll cost for parish employees. There were specific criteria that must be met for the loan to be forgiven by the federal government. We complied with those requirements and both our loans were forgiven.

Thanks to your generosity, we were able to fund the much needed projects of rebuilding the original parking lot, replacing the shingle roof on the church building, and replacing the 20-year old HVAC units with new ones which include ionizing air purifiers. (We especially thank Mr. Jim English for inspiring and kick-starting the Capital Contribution Campaign.)

Our outreach efforts remain strong, with record-breaking participation in the Cash For Food drives that help support the West Suburban Food Pantry, Downers Grove FISH, and Blue Jeans for the Homeless. The St. Vincent De Paul clothing and small household items collections, and the Electronics Recycling Events, also provide a valuable service to our entire community.

A change made this year is that the position of Director of Religious Formation is once again recognized as a full-time position, providing opportunities for education from Kindergarten through adults. While this is a significant financial investment, the goal is to provide a comprehensive, quality program to help form a strong Catholic conscience in our children and to help adults come to a better understanding of our faith.

Change is never easy, and we have experienced a lot of that with COVID-19 and the retirement of Corinne Hanson as Business Manager. I am pleased that Bryn Wildman (part-time Business Manager), Nova Baranski (part-time bookkeeper), and Mary Goba (part-time afternoon receptionist) have joined the staff and will provide our parish with excellent service in the years to come.

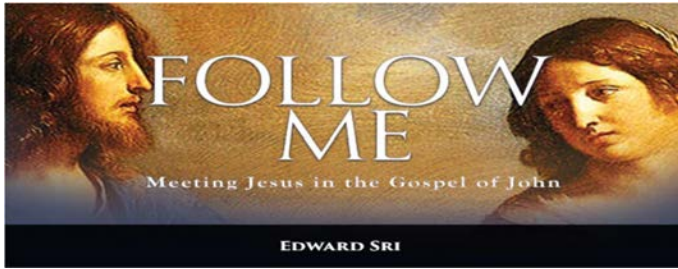
Thank you again for your support, both financial and prayerful. Please know that you are always in my prayers. Please keep the parish in your prayers and may God bless you each of you and your loved ones.
