

As the Diocese of Joliet launches the 2023 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal (CMAA). This year's CMAA theme is *We Belong to God.* Through our support, we ensure that the mission everyone. Together, we help the poor, vulnerable, increase vocations & educate people of all ages, ethnicities, and abilities in the faith.

Our parish's goal for the 2023 CMAA is \$43,500 and 70 percent of any amount we raise over our goal will be returned to us. CTS will receive a rebate of \$3,629 from the 2022 annual appeal.

Next weekend, February 18/19, is our in church commitment weekend campaign. Many parishioners have signed up directly from the initial diocese mailing. For those who have waited, the in pew commitment offers time for parishioners to say if they will be financially supporting the 2023 annual campaign. The annual commitment will take place during mass, following the homily message.



Weekly Stewardship Recommendation:

Lent is coming. Consider a "fast" for Creation Care... sacrificing some comfort, giving up a wasteful practice, or modifying your actions to reduce harm to the environment. Some ideas include: A Meat Fast: How about adding a meatless Monday to meatless Fridays? What about eating only chicken when you do eat meat, or sustainably caught fish?

An Energy Fast: How about turning the thermostat down 2°-5° F lower than usual and putting that sweater on? And maybe turn the water heater down to 120° F and only take 3-minute showers?

A "Stuff" Fast: Buying only the bare minimum of essentials you need and simplifying your life? And how about staying away from as much plastic as you can and minimizing your waste stream?

40-Hours Devotion



The 40-hours devotion is typically celebrated by the Blessed Sacrament being exposed for a 40-hour period in one location, minus the time taken for Mass. Participants may say prayers, rosaries, litanies,

chaplets, and read reflections, guided meditations, the bible, etc. When it is more feasible, the 40-hours are interrupted for the night and extended over several days. The solemn closing of the 40-hours devotion often includes Benediction of the Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.



During those hours each Sunday, you have an opportunity to spend time with Our Blessed Lord thanking Him, praising Him, loving Him, and listening to Him.

If you come for an hour each Sunday, that is wonderful, but maybe you have less time; or maybe you can only come on one of the Sundays -that would be fine too but try to come to "Watch and Pray" with the Lord Jesus at some time.

Each Sunday, our 10 hours of Exposition will close with Benediction.

Also, as part of Lenten Sunday activities, on March 12 at 7:00pm Fr. Matthew Jamesson from the Archdiocese of Chicago will be our guest speaker.
