# THE Transfiguration OF THE LORD

#### **National Eucharistic Revival**



Then, while there is yet time.....we must make hast to do now what will profit us forever.
- Saint Benedict



#### THE PURPOSE OF THE TRANSFIGURATION

Immediately following Peter's confession that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, we are given the account of the Transfiguration in which Christ's humanity is transformed and glorified before the apostles Peter, James, and John.

The main purpose of revealing His glory to these men was to strengthen their faith, the faith just confessed by Peter. For Christ was about to go down to Jerusalem, suffer, and die. Indeed, such a humiliating death is certainly not the kind of thing that a devout Jew of this time would think befitting of a king, let alone the King of Kings, God Himself. Therefore, in order to strengthen them, Christ revealed to them His divine glory in His human body. Having seen His glory, it would be difficult for the apostles to doubt that Christ's suffering and death was not something that He had fully chosen to endure. It would have been obvious to them that Christ had the power to save Himself if He had chosen to do so, therefore Christ must have had a reason for His passion and everything would be okay in the end. The Transfiguration then was meant to strengthen the faith of the apostles that was about to be tested during the passion.

Likewise, the Transfiguration served as a foretaste of the glory of the Resurrection. Not only the Resurrection of Christ but also of the final resurrection when all of the justified will be reunited with their bodies at the end of time. As St. Leo the Great said in regards to the Transfiguration, "with no less foresight, the foundation was laid of the Holy Church's hope, that the whole body of Christ might realize the character of the change which it would have to receive, and that the members might promise themselves a share in that honour which had already shone forth in their Head" (Sermon 51).


on your child's developmental level for Kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. We are committed to helping your child come to know and love God and to help your family grow in their faith.



#### **Sacrament Reminder**

Don't forget if your child is planning on making a sacrament that **the Diocese of Joliet requires that children complete a minimum of two consecutive years of religious formation** *before* **receiving sacraments.** Typically, in 2nd grade, our children receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the late fall and the

Sacrament of Eucharist in the spring. (Children must have participated in RF in first and second grade or two other consecutive years of preparation). Preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation, which will be conferred at the end of 8th grade according to the Bishop's schedule begins in 6th and 7th grade. (Full participation in RF in 7th and 8th grade is the minimum enrollment required.)

Each year an area the size of South Carolina is deforested worldwide, adding to biodiversity loss and contributing significantly to planetary warming. Make sure the lumber you (or your contractor) use for your next project carries the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certification. The FSC program is an independent, nongovernmental, nonprofit organization established to promote the sustainable management of the world's forests. Evaluation is typically performed by an independent third party. Certification can assure consumers that they are buying forest-related products that were grown, harvested and processed sustainably, protecting the resource for future generations.
