

In his message, Pope Francis invites us to set our hearts ablaze with faith and put our faith into action, serving God's mission with joy, enthusiasm, and tireless dedication. Important Statistics Regarding Domestic Violence

How prevalent is domestic violence in our country? The following statistics may surprise you. On average, <u>20 people per minute</u> are physically abused by an intimate partner. *Ten million men and wom-en* face physical abuse yearly in the United States.

50% of people have experienced emotional abuse.

1 in 4 Christian marriages includes abuse. People in <u>Christian marriages</u> tend to stay longer than nonbelievers.

• 1 in 15 children is exposed to domestic violence each year, and 90% of these children are eyewitnesses to the violence.

1 in 3 children who witness domestic violence are also victim's of child abuse.

More than 20,000 phone calls are placed to domestic violence hotlines daily.

Everyone knows someone who is a victim or a survivor of domestic abuse. If you think you don't know someone who is or who has faced this, think again. Victims overwhelmingly hide abuse because they are afraid that exposing it will make things worse or put them in even more danger.

Impacts of Domestic Violence

Domestic violence can have a long-lasting and devastating impact on a family. Spouses and children who are the targets of abuse have higher rates of anxiety, depression, PTSD, and suicidal behavior. Victims of domestic violence are at <u>higher risk</u> for developing drug, tobacco, and alcohol addictions.

The effects of abuse don't stop with the victim. Children who witness domestic violence and abuse are three times more likely to engage in violent and aggressive behavior than their peers. Children also have increased anxiety, depression, insomnia, nightmares, and difficulty concentrating. Week 3 will appear in the October 15th bulletin.

No child should be denied being taught about God just because their parents cannot afford to send their child or children to religious classes. To help our parents pay for Religious Formation classes. we have started Religious Formation Sponsorship program. We invite you to become part of the Faith Forward, Christ the Servant Religious Forward, Formation's Sponsorship Program. Βv sponsoring the faith formation of a child - by passing your faith forward — you help to lay the foundation and shape the future of both our children and the whole of our Catholic community.

Faith There are several ways to financially assist in passing your faith forward:

A 175.00 donation will pay for one year of religious formation tuition

\$100.00 will pay for the Sacrament fee of a child who cannot afford the fees for receiving a Sacrament

\$25.00 will purchase a child's textbook for the year.

<u>Sacrament Reminder</u>



Don't forget, if your child is planning on making a Sacrament the Diocese of Joliet requires children complete a minimum of two consecutive years of Religious

Formation *before* **receiving Sacraments.** Typically, in 2nd grade, our children receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the late fall and the Sacrament of Eucharist in the spring. (Children must have participated in RF in first and second grade or two other consecutive years of preparation). Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation, which will be conferred at the end of 8th grade according to the Bishop's schedule begins in 6th and 7th grade. (Full participation in RF in 7th and 8th grade is the minimum enrollment required.)


