

- 3. Advocate for Reform: Reach out to your state legislators and emphasize the need for domestic violence resources and stricter penalties for abusers.
- 4. **Donate to a Shelter or Family in Need**: Many families who have escaped from abuse end up in a shelter for some time. If you can't donate financially, consider donating clothing and essential hygiene items to help. Some organizations help survivors get back on their feet and start fresh, and they need donations to do so.
- 5. **Listen to a Podcast or Read Articles**: Take the time to listen to some podcasts and read articles about domestic violence. Share them on your social media and discuss them with others.
- 6. Start the Conversation and Speak Up about Domestic Violence.

## Sacramental Information

RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith, the celebration of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation are invited to contact the parish office.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:00 AM. A Baptism Preparation Class must be attended if you are planning your first child's baptism or if three years have passed since your last child was baptized. Call the Parish Office to register and to check whether adjustments have been made to the schedule.

MARRIAGE Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

No child should be denied being taught about God just because their parents cannot afford to send their child or children to religious classes. To help our parents pay for Religious Formation classes. we have started Religious Formation Sponsorship program. We invite you to become part of the Faith Forward, Christ the Servant Religious Forward, Formation's Sponsorship Program. sponsoring the faith formation of a child - by passing your faith forward — you help to lay the foundation and shape the future of both our children and the whole of our Catholic

There are several ways to financially assist in passing your faith forward:

A \$175.00 donation will pay for one year of religious formation

\$100.00 will pay for the Sacrament fee of a child who cannot afford the fees for receiving a Sacrament

\$25.00 will purchase a child's textbook for the year.

#### <u>Sacrament Reminder</u>



Don't forget, if your child is planning on making a Sacrament the Diocese of Joliet requires children complete a minimum of two consecutive years of Religious

Formation before receiving Sacraments. Typically, in 2nd grade, our children receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the late fall and the Sacrament of Eucharist in the spring. (Children must have participated in RF in first and second grade or two other consecutive years of preparation). Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation, which will be conferred at the end of 8th grade according to the Bishop's schedule begins in 6th and 7th grade. (Full participation in RF in 7th and 8th grade is the minimum enrollment required.)

## Creation Care Corner

#### Avoid products containing palm oil from the grocery store.

Palm oil is a popular vegetable oil used in candy bars, snack foods, cookies, baked goods, packaged foods, and personal care products. Too often palm oil tree plantations destroy enormous tracts of virgin tropical forests, exploit child labor, grab land from local communities and devastate critical habitat for elephants, orangutans, and tigers. The burning of tropical forests for palm oil plantations also releases enormous amounts of CO<sub>2</sub> into the atmosphere. Compare labels and try to avoid products with palm oil.
