

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.


FUNERAL: Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.



This Summer, Youth Group is back!



Children grades 5-12 are invited to join Religious Formation every other week this Summer for a different activity intended to illustrate a concept from Sacred Scripture and Tradition.

CTS's Religious Formation Invites Children to VBS Scuba: Diving into friendship with God!

A summer kids' event called Scuba VBS will be hosted at Christ the Servant from June 10 to June 14. At Scuba, kids explore what it means to have a friendship with God! Kids participate in memorable Bible-learning activities, sing catchy songs, play teamwork-building games, devour yummy treats, experience one-of-a-kind Bible adventures, collect Bible Memory Buddies to remind them of God's love, and test out sciencey-fun experiments that get imagination bubbling. Plus, kids will learn to look for evidence of God all around them through something called God Sightings. Each day concludes with a Fin-tastic Finale that gets everyone involved in living what they've learned.

Scuba is for kids from kindergarten to 4th grade and will run from 9:30 to 11:45 each day. The cost is \$70 and includes a T-shirt. (Kids 5th grade and older are welcomed to join us as team leaders and are Free!!)



Come join us Sunday, June 2 after the 10:00 Mass for a Corpus Christi Procession



Feast of Corpus Christi, also called Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is on June 2 this year.

In honor of the real presence of the body (*corpus*) of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, Religious Formation is planning on having a Corpus Christi procession.

What is a Corpus Christi procession? It is a "public witness of faith and worship of the Most Blessed Sacrament." Founded upon the Church's belief that Jesus becomes substantially present to us in the Eucharist at Mass, the Corpus Christi procession is one of the ways that we express our devotion to Christ.

A Corpus Christi procession usually begins after the celebration of Mass, at which the host for the procession is consecrated. Placed in a monstrance (a sacred vessel that displays the sacred host to the faithful), the Blessed Sacrament is then carried out of the church and through the streets or neighborhood accompanied by the songs and prayers of the people. (CTS procession will be around the circle in the parking lot). In this way the Church shows that Christ, here among us, walks with us on our pilgrimage to heaven.



Creation Care Corner ("Care for Creation"

The Pope's encyclical, Laudato Si',

challenges us to rethink our relationship with nature. He reframes the environmental dialogue from a political discussion into language of faith. Creation, the natural world around us and all living things in it, is recognized as a precious gift from God to be revered by all. Our pervasive "throwaway" culture, combined with deforestation, and massive industrial and agricultural pollution is seriously degrading the earth, our common home.

Francis also points out the solid scientific consensus that human activity is the main contributor to a warming climate and warns of a worsening crisis. Without change, additional harmful sea level rise, droughts, water shortages and negatively impacted crop yields are expected.

Since the livelihoods of the poor will be most impacted, it becomes a moral imperative to take action. Pope Francis urges us to take action to mitigate these outcomes by working to protect our common home and by eliminating wastefulness in our lives.
