

**NEW PARISHIONERS:** We welcome you to Christ the Servant! Registration forms are available in the narthex by the Sacristy. Please feel free to ask a host member where to find forms, Religious Formation information & the bulletin.

**RECONCILIATION**: Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Baptism is celebrated twice a month, first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:00 am. Patents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class, offered the first Thursday of each month. You must register for the preparation class by calling the parish office at: 630-910-0770.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

**FUNERAL:** Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.



# THE PURPOSE OF THE TRANSFIGURATION



The main purpose of revealing His glory to these men was to strengthen their faith, the faith just confessed by Peter.

die. Indeed, such a humiliating death is certainly not the kind of thing that a devout Jew of this time would think befitting of a king, let alone the King of Kings, God Himself. Therefore, in order to strengthen them, Christ revealed to them His divine glory in His human body. Having seen His glory, it would be difficult for the apostles to doubt that Christ's suffering and death was not something that He had fully chosen to endure. It would have been obvious to them that Christ had the power to save Himself if He had chosen to do so, therefore Christ must have had a reason for His passion and everything would be okay in the end. The Transfiguration then was meant to strengthen the faith of the apostles that was about to be

tested during the passion.

For Christ was about to go down to Jerusalem, suffer, and

Likewise, the Transfiguration served as a foretaste of the glory of the Resurrection. Not only the Resurrection of Christ but also of the final resurrection when all of the justified will be reunited with their bodies at the end of time. As St. Leo the Great said in regards to the Transfiguration, "with no less foresight, the foundation was laid of the Holy Church's hope, that the whole body of Christ might realize the character of the change which it would have to receive, and that the members might promise themselves a share in that honour which had already shone forth in their Head" (Sermon 51).



genuinely happy to be able to work with your family to prepare and receive the Sacraments. The Sacraments are God's great gift to mankind and so there is great joy in being able to share this wonderful gift and work of God with your family. The seven Sacraments touch all the stages and all the important moments of Christian life: "they give birth and increase, healing and mission to the Christian's life of faith. There is thus a certain resemblance between the stages of natural life and the stages of the spiritual life." (St Thomas Aquinas)

## **Sacrament Reminder**

Don't forget, if your child is planning on making a Sacrament the Diocese of Joliet requires children complete a minimum of two consecutive years of Religious Formation before receiving Sacraments. Typically, in 2nd grade, our children receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the late fall and the Sacrament of Eucharist in the spring. (Children must have participated in RF in first and second grade or two other consecutive years of preparation). Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation, which will be conferred at the end of 8th grade according to the Bishop's schedule begins in 6th and 7th grade. (Full participation in RF in 7th and 8th grade is the minimum enrollment required.)

# WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION

Dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW)

Leftover household products that can catch fire, react, or explode under certain circumstances, or that are corrosive or toxic are considered HHWs. Products such as paints, cleaners, oils, batteries, and pesticides can contain hazardous ingredients and require special care when you dispose of them. Do not dispose HHWs to landfills, or pour into drains or ditches. Save toxic chemicals and electronic materials for periodic collections. Check with your city, township or county for upcoming HHW collection events, and with your state EPA office for permanent HHW drop site locations. Unused medications can also have harmful effects, including polluting waterways and the environment if they are flushed or thrown in the trash. Some local police stations and large retail pharmacies (Meijer) take back unused meds. Don't forget that electronics are also hazardous waste.
