

NEW PARISHIONERS: We welcome you to Christ the Servant! Registration forms are available in the narthex by the Sacristy. Please feel free to ask a host member where to find forms, Religious Formation information & the bulletin.

RECONCILIATION: Available Saturdays from 4:00-4:30 pm (except Holy Saturday), or by appointment with Fr. Bob.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptism is celebrated twice a month, first and third Sundays of each month (except during Lent) at 11:00 am. Patents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class, offered the first Thursday of each month. You must register for the preparation class by calling the parish office at: 630-910-0770.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Marriage arrangements must be made at least six months in advance by contacting the Parish Office to set the date and reserve the church. Reserve the church before you reserve the reception hall.

FUNERAL: Arrangements for funerals are usually made in cooperation with the attending funeral home. Contact the parish office for pre-planning of funerals.



October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month DV and Stalking

Stalking Prevention and Awareness Resource Center (SPARC) defines stalking as "A pattern of behavior directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for the person's safety or the safety of others; or suffer substantial emotional distress." Stalking is an issue that affects all genders, and SPARC estimates that 1 in 3 women and 1 in 6 men will experience stalking of some kind. The intersection between stalking and DV is a deep one as many people who choose harm use this means of oppression to keep tabs on their partners, current or former. Stalking is a means to show that they maintain control over these partners. There is no easy way to get out of an abusive situation, but a survivor finding out they are being stalked by an ex-partner can be terrifying. This is just another tactic employed by people who cause harm to drive fear and maintain a semblance of control. SPARC is one of the many agencies and organizations working in the intersectionality to end DV and stand against stalking. Intersectionality is defined as the concept that all oppression is linked. 

\$25.00 will purchase a child's textbook for the year.


Other sponsorships such as retreat expenses, high school programs, speaker engagements, classroom audio/video equipment are also available.

Reduce the Impact of Acquisition

WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION

It's always a good time to reflect on our relationship with the environment: how we live and how our lifestyles impact the natural world. The sum total of all our daily purchases can have a huge effect on our environment. Consider scrutinizing purchases that utilize non-renewable resources, that have excessive global warming emissions, or generate more toxic waste from their manufacture. Also try to be mindful that the next day delivery services we may prefer often utilize 1/2-empty trucks scurrying across town, contributing to more air pollution. Consider examining what you really need, how quickly you need it, its environmental impact, and whether it even needs to be a "new" purchase. Pope Francis has urged us to adopt more simple, sustainable lifestyles and to be mindful of our impact on and interdependence with nature. Less is more.
